DIY SEED BOMBS

Seeds need just the right conditions to begin growing. Seed bombs set your seeds up for success! Water them or place them outside before a good rain.

What you need:

- Air Dry Clay (or powdered clay)
- Ideally Compost or potting mix will do
- Assorted seeds
 - Native wildflower mix is great for pollinators, or you can choose other flowers, fruit, or vegetables – choose based on where you want to put them!
- Optional: scoops for removing clay (melon-ball scoops work well)

What to do:

- 1. If using air dry clay, scoop out a small amount about the size of a golf ball. Warm up the clay in your hands if it is cold, then flatten it into a pancake.
- 2. If using powdered clay, put some in a bowl and very slowly add water until the clay forms a moldable paste.
- 3.Add a small scoop of compost or potting soil to clay. Sprinkle a few small seeds (or one large seed, for a large seed such as sunflower) on your soil.
- 4. Carefully wrap the soil and seeds in the clay. If using air dry clay, form the clay around the soil into a ball. If using powdered clay, it may be easier to combine all of the ingredients and form the entire mixture into a ball.
- 5. Allow seed bombs to dry over several days, until hard to the touch. If making many seed bombs, consider repurposing an egg carton to hold the finished seed bombs.
- 6.Once dry, seed bombs can be placed in a prepared flower bed, tossed in a roadside ditch, or even set on top of a container planter. No need to "plant" the seed bomb by digging a hole just place it on the surface and watch it grow.

Tips:

March and November are the best months to sow wildflower seeds in Oklahoma. Experiment with a variety of seeds and place them in various locations.

Place seed bombs outside prior to a good rain or water them. Continue to water them as they begin to germinate and soon little sprouts will emerge.
